Programs

Volunteer Helping Hands (Caregiving)

Volunteer Helping Hands, Hospice Caring's patient and family program, offers short-term, practical, social and emotional support for people of all ages with a serious illness and no reasonable prospect of a cure.

Services include but are not limited to: companionship and emotional support, assistance with household tasks, respite care, patient advocacy, and limited transportation to appointments. Hospice Caring is licensed by the state of Maryland as a limited hospice care program. While we do not provide medical services, we supplement medical hospice and we also support patients who are still pursuing curative treatment.

Bereavement Services

Adult Support Groups

Bereavement support groups, facilitated by trained volunteers, allow participants to meet others who are also grieving, share their stories, and learn from one another. Specialized groups include adult child loss, parent loss, sibling or friend loss, spousal loss, and suicide loss. Additional groups are formed based on community need.

Good Grief Clubs for Children

These seven- week support groups help children in grades K-12 explore their feelings, develop healthy coping strategies, and find comfort and safety in learning that they are not alone. These groups are facilitated by trained Hospice Caring volunteers in partnership Montgomery County Schools, independent schools, and other community-based organizations.

Camp Caring for Children

This overnight weekend camp for grieving children, grades 2-5, includes age-appropriate discussions and fun-filled creative experiences designed to help children share their feelings with their peers. Camp Caring is offered in partnership between Hospice Caring and Bar-T, a premier childcare provider.

Community Education

Our Community Education program works to raise awareness and better equip people to address end-of-life and grief-related issues. We host an educational series called Seasons of Caring, teach lessons on loss and grief in schools, offer continuing education (CEU) workshops for professionals, and facilitate dialogue on relevant topics in the community.

Measuring our Impact

All Hospice Caring programs currently have some procedures and tools for assessing program performance, with a specific focus on participant feedback. Hospice Caring has wanted to strengthen its evaluation system for several years. This was made possible, in part, by Carol Walsh, a volunteer with skills in program performance measurement, who began serving Hospice Caring in November 2014. She joined an already active volunteer, Toni Robinson, who has expertise in data collection software.

Hospice Caring is adopting Mark Friedman's Results-Based Accountability (RBA) Framework, which has three questions to guide program performance measurement:

- 1) How Much Did We Do? measures outputs or service statistics
- **2) How Well Did We Do It?** measures adherence to effective practices and industry standards
- **3) Did It Make a Difference to Those Served?** measures the impact or change in participant behavior

Volunteer Spotlights

Carol Walsh joined Hospice Caring's team of volunteers after retiring from her position as Executive Director for the Montgomery County Collaboration Council for Children, Youth and Families, Inc., where she facilitated collaborative program design and secured public and private funds for systems development/change and/or direct services. Bereavement Support

124 adults participated in peer support groups





78 adults attended our Tree of Love memorial ceremony

173 children participated in Good Grief Clubs in 31 schools in Montgomery County

97% of students who participated in a Good Grief Club reported knowing more ways to deal with their feelings as a result of participating

Rachel's Story



Rachel has an honesty about her that immediately draws you in. Her eyes bare pain, but also hope.

She was first referred to Hospice Caring in 2013 by Montgomery County's ACCESS program in Behavioral Health Services. It

had been a decade since her younger brother, Matthew, had died by suicide, and she thought she had dealt with it.

"I was getting individual mental health counseling and was on anti-depressants but I was still struggling," said Rachel. "I had suppressed his suicide for a decade. My family avoided talking about it so I could only think about him when I was alone."

Compounding the difficulty of Matthew's death, Rachel's mother was battling cancer at the same time. "I pretended I was okay," said Rachel. "I had to be the strong one in the family."

When her mother died, Rachel said she "didn't know how to breathe or put one foot in front of the other." Rachel lost friends, left her job, and moved back to Maryland from Los Angeles. She needed help.

"When I arrived at Hospice Caring, I immediately knew I was in a compassionate place," said Rachel. "I was nervous to join the suicide survivors support group because I was the only one whose loss occurred so long ago. I was anticipating some judgement, but I received the opposite. The group gave me a safe place to feel my pain. I didn't have to be the strong one here, I just had to be strong enough to share my story.

"Someone who hasn't lost a loved one to suicide can't understand how it feels. Everyone in my group shared that experience. It's a totally different deep, deep, deep pain that never goes away but you learn to deal with it. The group gave me a sense of peace because it was so profound.

"Hospice Caring's facilitators set the stage and provided a safe space for us, but they let the group set the tone for how we wanted to talk about the suicides. There was flexibility regarding content, time, and the level of emotion we could delve into. We made our own rules so we could share our own way. The group provided a level of nurturing that one could never get in a solution oriented therapy group.

"I am a social worker by training, so I understood grief intellectually, but until I came to Hospice Caring I couldn't make it work for me emotionally . In being able to receive compassion, I was able to give compassion. We all felt the sadness and we were all able to lift each other up."

Liberty's Promise supports young immigrants in need while encouraging them to be active and conscientious American citizens.

Embracing Mental Health First Aid

Thanks to the Mental Health
Association, Hospice Caring had the
chance to train numerous staff and
volunteers in Mental Health First Aid,
an evidence-based, award winning,
certification program that educates
individuals on how to help someone in
a mental health crisis. This training has
helped us improve our capacity to
connect those in crisis with
appropriate support.

Sharing our Expertise

Mary Washington Hospice, in Fredericksburg, VA., engaged Hospice Caring for consultation, training and technical assistance while they were updating their volunteer training program. Our staff provided two full days of training on our volunteer model for their team of staff and volunteers.

Adolescents and Young Adults Project

This year, Hospice Caring partnered with the Brendan Ogg Memorial Foundation and the Smith Center for Healing and the Arts to assist in collecting background information needed to develop a program to help friends of adolescents and young adults (AYA) with cancer get better informed, prepared and involved in the cancer journey.

Three focus group discussions with 29 AYAs were held. All participants had received an initial diagnosis of cancer between 15 and 39 years old and were anywhere from 1 to 9 years into survivorship. The data collected validates the need for a support program for this population. Hospice Caring compiled some of the data into a publication titled "Supporting Young Adult Friends with Cancer" (below). Under the leadership of Jackie Ogg, MSW, LGSW, the project has since drawn national recognition.

Friends Supporting Young Adults with Cancer

Hospice Caring, Inc. and The Smith Center have collaborated to hold focus groups to explore the ways in which friends can be most supportive when a young person is diagnosed with cancer. The following list was developed using feedback from focus group participants.

DO

- Reach out but don't expect or even ask for an answer when you call me
- Keep your help simple and practical
- Listen, hold space, just be present
- Try to understand just how life altering this is for me
- Try to understand that you may just not "get it" enough or in the same way those with cancer will
- Ask yourself: "What if it were me?"
- Get informed
- Find others to support you; I can't
- Understand that your life will go forward and mine will be on hold
- Realize that where I thought I was heading in my life may not be where I want to go now
- Support my interest in finding new friends who have been where I am now

DON'T

- Expect an answer from me but know that I do appreciate your reaching out
- Wait for me to ask for help
- Be superficial but do help me keep it light or humorous when I want to
- Minimize the fact that I have cancer in the prime of my life
- Say "I know how you feel" unless you have had cancer and really do
- Negate my fears and worries
- Expect me to inform you on every aspect of my treatment
- Get jealous or hurt with the attention I receive; I didn't ask for this
- Deny the physical impact or changes of the disease or treatment
- Rely on me to know what I want I've never been here before
- Get jealous or hurt when I start to gravitate to others who have had cancer







Community Education

New in 2015, **Hospice Caring's Community Education program** works to raise awareness and better equip people to address end-of-life and grief-related issues. We host an educational series called Seasons of Caring, teach lessons on loss and grief in schools, offer continuing education (CEU) workshops for professionals, and facilitate dialogue on relevant topics in the community.

Empathy in Patient Care Training

Medical and mental health professionals, hospice volunteers, and community members came together to attend our June 4 training on Empathy in Patient Care: When Treating People with Life Threatening Illnesses. The collaborative effort between Hospice Caring, Aspire Counseling, and the Universities at Shady Grove provided participants with the opportunity to reflect on their own healthcare experiences and how they affect their interactions with patients. This event was the official launch of Hospice Caring, Inc.'s Community Education program.





